In order to minimize accidents and cases of ill health, the Authority is committed to:-

1. Developing and maintaining effective Occupational Health, Safety and Welfare arrangements to protect its staff and all who come into contact with its operations.
2. Continuous improvement of Occupational Health and Safety performance following industry best practice.
3. Compliance with all relevant legal and statutory instruments in all matters of Occupational Health and Safety.
4. Providing an effective Occupational Health and Safety Management System (HSMS) to help manage health and safety risks.
5. Providing adequate resources to analyse and review accident trends to prevent recurrence.
6. Ensure Contravention of the Occupational Health and Safety Management System attracts severe disciplinary action including dismissal and/or prosecution.
